



Random Things #4: The Death's Head Hawk Moth

Today I will be telling you about the Death's Head Hawk moth.

First of all, what is a moth? Moths are a kind of flying insect. The word "moth" isn't actually a very specific label as there are many different kinds of moths. The term is more like the term "fish", as there are lots of kinds of fish, and it is more of a term for conversational/linguistic ease than it is a term for scientific accuracy. That is also true for "moth". "Butterfly" on the other hand is a very specific term as it is only one specific family of Lepidoptera (/ləpə'dɒptərə/) (the scientific name for butterflies and moths), and moths are everything else in Lepidoptera.

Lepidoptera literally means scale (lepídos) wings (pterá) in Ancient Greek. Lepidoptera is one of the few flying insects with scales and this is the reason for the name. One big misconception about moths is that all moths eat your clothes when in fact that is just one very specific kind of moth. So what is a Hawk moth?

Hawk moths are a family of moths. They are also called Sphinx moths. Most of their caterpillars are called "hornworms". There are 3 species of Death's Head Hawk moths, Death's Head Hawk moth refers to the three species in the genus Acherontia the three species are, Acherontia atropos (the African Death's Head Hawk moth) who is the most widely recognized and has the brightest coloration (and is my personal favorite), Acherontia styx (the Lesser Death's Head Hawk moth or Bee Robber) which is found in eastern Asia, and Acherontia lachesis (the Greater Death's Head Hawk moth or Bee Robber) which is found in India. The Death's Head Hawk moth is a popular symbol in pop culture appearing most prominently in *The Silence of the Lambs*. Death's Head Hawk moths excrete a pheromone that smells exactly like the pheromones that bees produce, and this is how they can sneak into beehives undetected. They also make a loud chirping noise when they are startled or irritated. They make this noise by inhaling and exhaling air which vibrates their epipharynx like an accordion.

Thread, knitting + crochet tools, sewing needles, aida cloth, fabric (larger than 10" x 10", please no scraps!), elastic, zippers, leather, pins, lace, hemp, embroidery floss, rotary cutters, scissors, stencils, yarn, patterns (modern + unused), vintage and modern notions and tools, watercolor paper, craft paper, scrap booking paper, wallpaper (samples), sketchbooks, notebooks, stationery, envelopes, post-it notes, glue, tape, memo books, rulers, cards, stamps, stickers, ink pads, etc.

Any art related books, coloring books, sewing books, vintage books + maps, collage materials, vintage magazines (please no modern craft magazines), handmade books and zines.

They do **NOT** accept faux flowers/plants, holiday decorations, holiday specific books, or anything "Christmas" related, home linens, towels, sheets, drapes or tablecloths.

They do **NOT** accept anything toxic, combustible, or hazardous (including spray paints), anything with mold or mildew, especially pertaining to fabric and yarn books (except if art and craft-related), clothing and clothing hangers of any kind, electronics/appliances/sewing machines, fabric samples/tile samples, furniture, or house paint, small pieces of fabric (anything under 10" x 10") (Please no scraps!), anything broken or needing repair (especially sewing machines), binders or large office supplies, and anything that requires more than one person to carry.
